

## Becoming a Volunteer

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Volunteers play a special role at Saint Mary's and we thank you for expressing interest in becoming a volunteer. Our volunteers take pride in the service they provide to our patients, visitors, and staff. Join them in personal growth and fulfillment as you:

If you are dependable, energetic, and ready to join our exceptional team, please review the following requirements for becoming a volunteer:

- Able to commit to at least 4 hours (consecutively) of service per week
- Complete an employee health screening
- Complete a background check
- Obtain annual immunizations, including TB and flu shot
- Complete an annual series of education modules
- Attend Saint Mary's volunteer orientation

Other Requirements for Volunteers:

- Please note that we hold volunteers to the same code of conduct and dress code as our employees, which means that we **do not** allow: hair that is dyed non-natural colors; facial piercings (except for a singular nose stud); offensive tattoos.
- Unacceptable nails (both artificial and natural) are those that do not appear clean, healthy, and safe. Nail polish is permitted. Chipped nail polish is not permitted and must be removed. Nails that are overly long and could pose a risk of patient injury, impaired glove integrity, or reduced dexterity are considered unsafe.

If you are able to fulfill the above requirements, we encourage you to submit an application. Applications are accepted throughout most of the year, and we review all applications on a monthly basis. Please note that submission of an application does not guarantee you a volunteering position. Volunteers are brought on based on the needs of the hospital. If your availability and experience are a match for our current openings, you may be contacted for an in-person interview.

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
